

ALL ABOUT BELGIUM...

Belgium - a democratic country full of bon vivants!

To achieve fulfilment, it is essential to get out and meet people. Make a point of discovering and understanding your host commune, city and country.

Our country has lots of nice things to offer, but also a few shortcomings. The nice sides include Belgium's cultural diversity, its general prosperity, culinary specialties and a certain self-deprecating humour... Among its shortcomings, we can certainly mention the climate, but also the country's complex system of government. Belgium is a federal state, made up of different entities - the Communities and the Regions. The Regions are responsible for everything concerning the territory and its development, whereas the Communities are responsible for everything involving people: language, culture and education. Belgium has three official languages: French, Dutch and German.

Belgium has a total area of 30,528 km² and a population of about eleven million.

It is a constitutional monarchy. We have a king and are democratically governed by representatives elected by the people.

At first sight, Belgians might seem to you to be a bit cold. They're just not accustomed to chatting with people they don't know or greeting others when walking down the street. But once you get past these initial reservations, you will find that they are actually *bon vivants*, shaking your hand in greeting and giving you that "hug-and-kiss" when they know you better.

Belgians have a number of rights, duties and values.

Recognised rights include the right to demonstrate, the right to private property and the right to decent housing.

But Belgians must also fulfil a number of duties such as enrolling their children in schools, respecting cleanliness in public spaces, or voting.

Some values are particularly dear to Belgians, such as equality between men and women, solidarity between citizens and the freedom of thought and religion.

Jette is a friendly and open commune that values peace and understanding. Residents say there's a warm, village feel here.

Jette is one of the 19 communes of the Brussels-Capital Region, Belgium's only bilingual (French, Dutch) region.

Located 5 km from the centre of Brussels, Jette used to be a village before it was incorporated into the city. With its 117 ha of parks and woods within its total area of 504 ha, Jette is a green commune conscious of the environment and nature.

The atmosphere in Jette is friendly and pleasant, with its 50,000 inhabitants living in peace and relative harmony.

Just the right place for families, the art of good living is cultivated here. Apart from its four parks, Jette also has several playgrounds and a "Children's Farm".

The Miroir district is a shopping paradise, well known for its Sunday market, one of the largest in the capital.

WHAT DO I NEED TO DO FIRST?

Everybody living in Belgium has to have an ID document proving the identity and nationality of its holder. To be official, this document has to bear your photo and signature.

At the age of 12, a child is automatically issued an ID card by the citizens' registration office (*service de la population*) of the commune in which he has his main place of residence.

Once reaching the age of 15, you are obliged to always have your ID card with you.

REGISTERING WITH THE COMMUNE

The Jette authorities are there to help you with all the official things needing to be done.

If you do not speak / have problems speaking one of the country's languages, the commune can, at your request, provide telephone interpretation services. This involves the interpreter directly translating what you say and what you are asked.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs is responsible for legalising foreign documents needing to be recognised in Belgium (diplomas, birth certificates, medical certificates, etc.).

Certain foreign nationals may work in Belgium on presentation of a valid work permit. Certain foreign workers are exempted from the work permit requirement. LEARNING THE LANGUAGE

Belgium has three official languages: Dutch, French and German. Dutch and French are the two most commonly spoken.

Brussels, as the capital of Belgium and Europe, is a multicultural region in which all languages are spoken. With regard to the administration, Brussels is a bilingual region, with everybody able to be understood in French or Dutch.

RENTAL CONTRACTS

All apartments require a rental contract to be signed between the tenant and the owner of the apartment. Find out more!

RENTAL DEPOSIT

A rental deposit is often required, equivalent to 2 or 3 months' rent. This sum will be refunded at the end of your lease, on condition that nothing has been damaged in the apartment. It is therefore very important to conduct a thorough inspection of the premises before moving in / moving out.

FINDING A JOB

It is not easy to find a job when arriving from abroad. Even if you have a diploma, it will still need to be recognised. You also need to know the language, ranging from being able to get by to being fully proficient. You will also need to convince a prospective employer of your skills and qualifications.

You may possibly need guidance or retraining, or perhaps need to take a vocational training course. There are people and organisations there to help you.

The Jette Employment Centre is a one-stop shop for everything to do with employment. It houses the commune's employment department, the local employment agency (ALE), the Jette branch of Actiris (Brussels Region Public Employment Organisation) and CPAS Employment Services. These are all there to help you find a job, to guide you in finding the right training programme, etc.

UNDER THREES

If you have children under 3, there are childcare facilities available. You will have to pay for using them.

In the commune's own facilities, the amount is dependent on your income. Private childcare facilities work with fixed prices set in advance.

There is also a baby clinic run by ONE, staffed by medical and social workers, where children go for check-ups. You can take advantage of such a check-up to make sure that your child is in good health and growing properly. You can also have your child vaccinated here. For more information:

If you are in difficulties, for example needing healthcare yourself, taking part in a literacy or a vocational training course, there are emergency childcare facilities (in French) available for your child. This is also an opportunity for your child to come into contact with other children and French-speakers.

PRIMARY HEALTHCARE - WHERE TO GO

General practitioners (GPs) and specialists
